“Statement of Agustin, known as Chobo in his homeland, eighteen years old, from the same coffee plantation (through an interpreter).

. . . the contramayoral Joaquin spoke to him about the scheme that he had for all the slaves on the farm, together with those from other nearby farms, to mutiny and kill the whites, become free, and establish themselves in Banes . . .”
